

Francis Hugh Fox

12th June 1863 – 28th May 1952

Francis Hugh Fox played club rugby for Wellington RFC, the Marlborough Nomads, Somerset (45 appearances, Captain 1888-93) and was one of the original members of the Barbarians Football Club. He lived in the Somerset countryhouse of Woolcombe, near Wellington (now a hotel) then later Tone Dale House which is still occupied by the Fox family, he was educated at Marlborough College, a school which had

Fox was awarded his England Cap in 1888, even though no

international matches were played that year. A dispute between the RFU and the other home unions in relation to a body being appointed to arbitrate on matters arising from international matches, When the 'International Board' the name of the committee set up to discuss dispute and policies concerning International matches first met the RFU boycotted the meeting in 1886 and again in 1887, this prompted the other home unions to take action by refusing to play the senior rugby nation until a four nations board was established. Fox received his England Cap in 1888 when a team was selected by the RFU and all players were awarded an international Cap in a team that never played. Of the XV selected two members 'Robert Robertshaw and Harry Eagles' would never play in a full England International, but were awarded an England Cap.

Two years after receiving his England Cap Fox was selected to play in his first International against Wales in Dewsbury 15th Feb 1890, Wales won the match in windy/snowy conditions thanks to a try by William 'Buller' Stadden.



The following month he was again picked for England against Scotland in Raeburn Place 'Edinburgh' 1st March 1890, England would win the match 6 points to nil.

Fox's England experience was curtailed when sadly he declined the offer of a third International cap due to commitments with the family mill - a woollen and worsted clothing mill operating since 1772.

A founder member of the Barbarians RFC he would represent them on two occasions 1st April 1891 vs Devonshire and 26th Dec 1891 vs Devonshire.
